Fee Payment Schedule

All fees and forms are to be turned in to your pack camp coordinator

January 5-April 17 Early Bird reservations \$15 per Scout (**non-refundable**)

April 17 Early Bird deadline: Fees, health forms, copies of parent's insurance card front & back), & attendance rosters are due in the Scout Service Center

April 17– 2 weeks before camp: Regular fee reservations accepted (**non-refundable**)

April 17 Workshop forms due

Final payment of regular camp fees, rosters and health forms are due to a CAC Scout Service Center at least 2 weeks prior to your scheduled camp date.

Camp Belzer offers family camping on Friday night. Family camping is \$7 per person (Scout, parent, and sibling). Family overnight registration forms and fees are to be turned in during your week at camp. Registration deadline is 2 p.m. Thursday.

REMEMBER: NO SCOUT CAN STAY IN A TENT WITH A NON RELATED ADULT

INFORMATION FOR ALL DAY CAMPS

Leadership: Each pack provides its own leadership through parents, leaders, and other family members. All camp leaders must be registered members of the Boy Scouts of America. **National BSA policy requires two-deep adult leadership.** A minimum of two adults must be in camp. At least one leader must be 21 years of age; others may be 18 or older. A Scout to adult ratio of 10 to 1 per schedule group is required at day camp.

Refunds: Refund request forms must be turned in **before the last day a pack is at camp. Refunds are processed at the close of the camping season.** Refunds are available only in case of hardships, e.g. summer school, injury, illness or custody problems and will be sent out after camp ends for the year.

Health History: A completed health history form (**MUST** sign both sides), signed by a parent is due with final payment of fees. **EVERY PERSON** in camp must turn in a health history form including adults and tag-a-longs. Your unit camper insurance covers your Scout while at camp.

Workerships: Partial Workerships are available for Scouts needing assistance with camp fees. Maximum Workership award is 50% of the early bird camp fee. The remainder of the fee needs to be paid before filing for Workership. An age appropriate project must be completed to earn the award. Application must be filed by April 17th.
