

# Camp Belzer

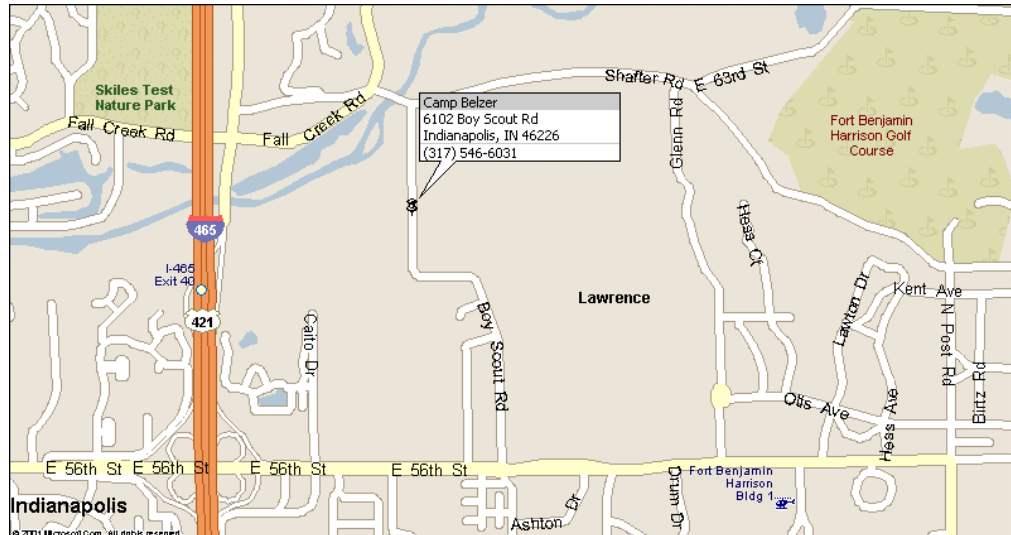
## Introduction

Is one of America's 10 Oldest Boy Scout Camps (1918). Located near Indianapolis, Indiana (Crossroads of America Council), Camp Belzer is named after the creator of the Firecrafters organization, Francis O. Belzer, who was the longtime professional in Indianapolis. It was originally called Camp Chank-Tun-Un-Gi (which meant "loud, happy place") and is a 130 acre camp next to Fall Creek. It was renamed Camp Belzer in 1948 after the death of their "Chief".

Camp Belzer has 10 campsites, a Webelos area, the Gyro Center meeting hall, a swimming pool and is on 130 acres of rugged and wooded campsites on Fall Creek. The Akela Trail for Cub Scouts operates out of this camp. Belzer is used for Cub Scout Day Camp during the summer months. Camp Belzer is also a base for the Voyageur Canoe Training program and outfitting.

## Directions From Christ the King

Step	Instruction	Distance
1	Depart <b>Christ the King</b> on East Kessler Blvd East Drive (East)	2.5 miles
2	Turn <b>LEFT (North)</b> onto Fall Creek Road	2.9 miles
3	Turn <b>RIGHT (East)</b> onto Shafter Road	0.1 miles
4	Turn <b>RIGHT (South)</b> onto Boy Scout Road	0.3 miles

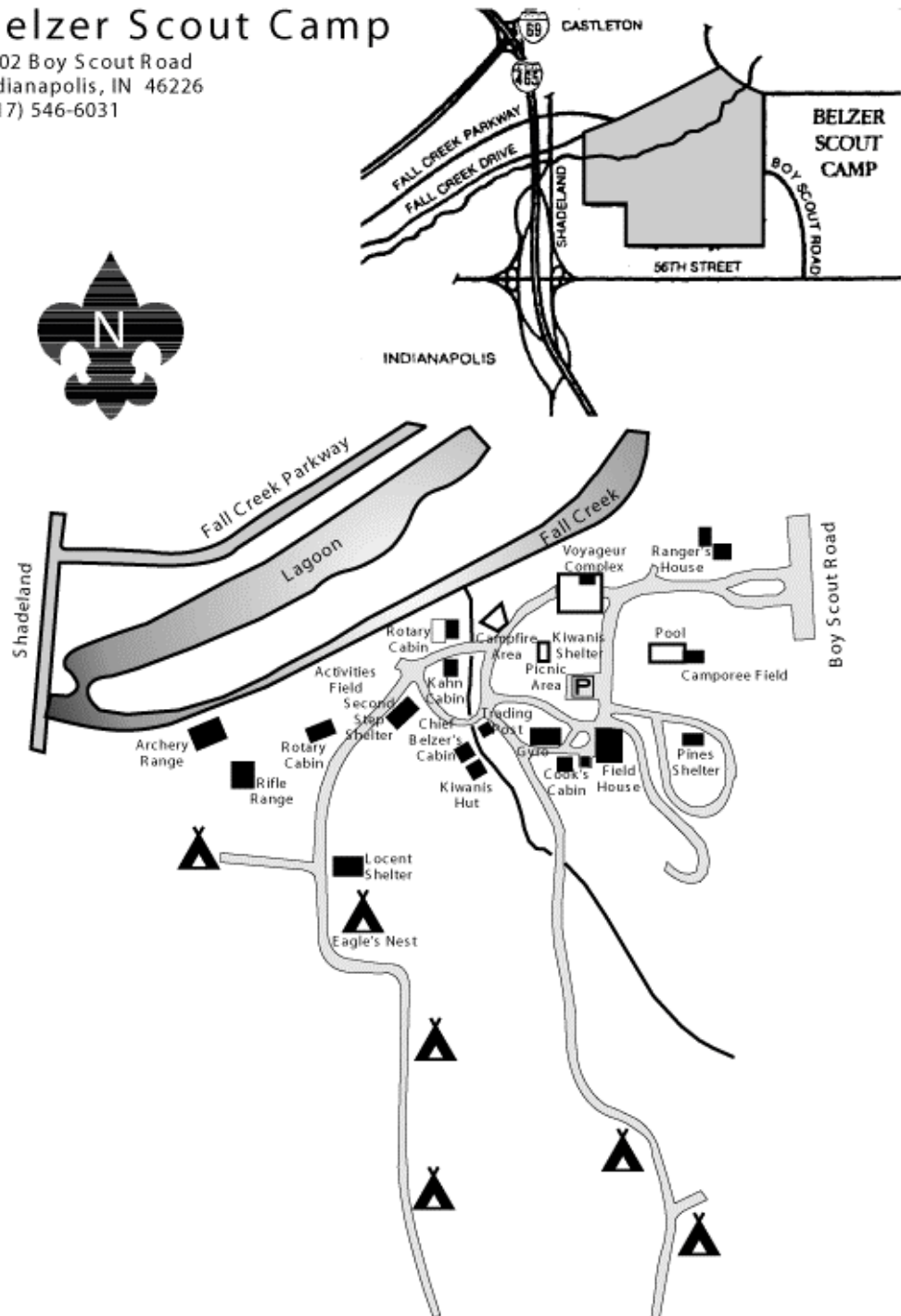
